

Harley Davidson: 109 years ago

<u>By "Happy"</u>

o let's talk about Harley Davidson 109 years ago. So we're talking 1914 what were the changes? What did Harley Davidson do different that year? How did it start to shape us as an every day culture?

Well the Two-Speed Harley-Davidson was the ideal machine for sidecar use. The two-speed Harley-Davidson was not simply adapted for sidecar use-it is built for it. So in turn they devised a whole set of features that were extremely desirable on a motorcycle. When used in connection with a sidecar—a satisfactory starter, a sturdy twospeed gear, double brake control, double clutch control. The Harley-Davidson was the only motorcycle offering the advantages of these features.

Step-Starter With a sidecar it was decidedly awkward and almost imposible to lift the machine on to the stand for starting. With the Harley-Davidson Step-Starter this became completely unnecessary.

A simple downward push on either pedal started the motor. The Harley-Davidson two-speed was the simplest, lightest and the most powerful twospeed on the market. Bither speed could be engaged by the shifting of a convenient lever, whether the machine is standingstill or in motion. The double brake control with the sidecar the brake must necessarily be extra large in order to handle the double load. The Harley-Davidson auto type band brake could have been operated by either foot or, in fact, by both feet if desired. The large Harley-Davidson brake carried a safety factor of more than 200% and was built large enough to stop an automobile. Perfect control of any vehicle is essentil to the safety of its occupants. They believed that the Harley-Davidson had the largest and most powerful brake of any self-propelled vehicle on the road. The double clutch control. The clutch on the Harley-Davidson was operated by hand lever or foot pedal at the option of the rider. It was not necessary to remove either hand from the handlebars in order to engage or release the clutch. This was a decided advantage in heavy sand or mud.

So, with all of the new innovations its every day use became more abundant . You were seeing more and more police forces and the us postal service. Outside of that you were seeing every day people using them as their main

be of transportation. So all of the innovations that they were coming up with it was helping it become a motorcycle for the every day rider. If Harley - Davidson didn't do these things. Would they still just be a flat track motorcycle today? Or would they be the iconic motorcycle brand they have turned out to be?



Theft

y duffel bags were gone. I searched inside my tent, and around outside it again. They were definitely missing. Hoping to turn rising panic into a direction, I desperately tried finding a way of either retrieving what was gone, or adjusting to its absence.

One bag held all my bungee cords and a couple ratchet straps, an vital part of my traveling mode and longer term campsites. They were used to support a simple A-frame shelter for single night camping, with a bungee going from midway down a tarp's side to my Sportster's handlebar, and a ratchet strap from the opposite midpoint of the tarp edge to a tree trunk or fence post. I'd stake down the tarp's sides, then set up my bedroll under the temporary shelter and have a quick pack-up in the morning. The bungee cords had myriad uses around a longer term campsite, but they had been stowed, for my minimalist campsite near my workstation, in one of two small black duffel bags.

The second bag had cookstove fuel and assorted packs of dehydrated snacks and other camping foods in it, along with some clothing and a few small trash bags.

Both bags had arrived along with me just prior to my first shift starting. A few hours before that, I'd been determinedly heading east on Interstate 90, trying to get to the music festival before the gates opened on Thursday. I'd planned to get there early enough to unload my bike and set up my campsite, then relax for a bit before starting the ignominious but important job of keeping bathrooms clean and soap and tail napkin supplies plentiful.

As I'd ridden along, engine thomping steadily and miles passing by underfoot, I'd realized that the soft landing with

enough time to have a quick meal and watch the crowds build outside the gate wasn't going to happen.

I'd been too slow getting across Wisconsin. Taking a ferry across Lake Michigan, then exploring back roads, had led to hours being lost, and travel time I had to make up for by riding from dawn to dusk the next day. The morning after had been a similar early departure, hastily packing up the tarp of my single night

camp, swilling down a cup of coffee and then securing my metal mug with a bungee cord through its handle, then pointing my 883's front wheel toward the sunrise and heading for the music festival entrance where I'd arrived exhaustedly, just as the main gate was opening at midday.

Grateful to have made it on time, albeit barely, I signed in as a member of the crapper crew and rode my road piglet to the campground of my workstation, a small building filled with flush toilets for which I was taking responsibility over the weekend. After quickly setting up my tent nearby and leaving duffel bags filled with sundries next to it, I ran to begin work.

> Some of my favorite bands were playing my favorite type of music in one of my favorite places, and I got to be part of putting it on. My first shift was spent happily meeting people, replenishing bathroom supplies, unclogging messes vou don't want to hear about, and enjoying music coming from the stage nearby.

At the end of the shift, I wandered from the crappers to my campsite, listening to music waft from the main

stage, idly contemplating the schedule of who was playing when, and thinking about tightening the drive chain on my bike.

My blissful music festival daze exploded into a rage as I realized my campsite had been despoiled. Furious, I headed to the security building on top of the venue's hill.

"My stuff was stolen," I announced once arriving there. "Two black duffel bags, one a bit smaller than the other. They need to get found."

A security staff member sized me up. I was, clearly, mad as could be, demanding that the entire security team stop their job of monitoring crowds and helping direct people to campgrounds and begin looking for petty thieves and my possessions instead.

Speaking to me with sympathy and patience, he told me what was sensible: "There are tens of thousands of people here. I get it that you need your stuff, but this place is packed. We've got a lot to do. I'll tell my guys to keep an eye out for your duffel bags but, honestly, you probably won't see them again."


He was right. And I knew it. I was on my own without my purloined possessions. There were four days of music until the festival was done. Four days to find my bungee cords, or else find a place to get a new set before packing up to leave on Sunday.

I knew the thieves were inexperienced. Had they been practiced thieves, they would have checked my bags soon after grabbing them, and realized that, unless someone uses Esbit campstove fuel, or has a burning need for bungee cords, most of the things stolen were useless. And my belongings would have been found tossed aside nearby.

It couldn't have been someone in good shape, I'd reasoned, because someone healthy and strong at a music festival probably wasn't stealing from campsites. They had no need.

It wasn't someone staying in the family camping area. People taking care of kids at music festivals don't have time

to, and don't generally, steal.

I was looking for inexperienced waiflike thieves who had been following a concert tour and stealing to get along. Knowing this, I began moving systematically through campgrounds at the venue, looking for my stuff.

I called out to people at their campsites, as they met their music festival neighbors and made drinks to take to the hill in front of the main stage, "I work the flushers on top of the hill. My stuff got stolen! Bungees, camp

stove fuel, shirts from Sturgis and the Rendezvous. If you see any of it, let me know. Please help spread the word."

A friend of mine I came upon who was directing traffic and keeping an eye on the packed campgrounds promised, like everyone I spoke with, to keep an eye out. Moving with an intensity borne of anger at my loss, I kept walking, trying to cover as much ground as I could on day one of the event. Daytime was rapidly giving way to nightfall and the chances of recovery would go down exponentially after each hour that passed.

As dusk approached, I saw two ratty psychedelic urchins squatting on their scrawny haunches next to two black duffel bags, peering confusedly into one filled with bungee cords, which they had unzipped, trying to make sense of their plunder.

I backtracked to where I'd seen my friend working, and told him that I needed a security team immediately. I'd found my stuff, I'd found the thieves, and I wanted my stuff back. Then I returned to the bungee burglars.

When I walked back the short distance to where they were, they had already begun taking my belongings out of my bags. One held aloft a bungee cord, both sides of it dripping down his scrawny arm and toward his quizzical face. My plan had been to keep them there, engaged in conversation, until the security team came. But I lost my mind to rage.

"That's some weird stuff in those bags,



isn't it," I yelled as as quick-stepped toward them.

Both heads swiveled toward me as I strode closer, calmness and sanity strewn somewhere on the road behind me. They gawped uncomprehendingly as I continued.

"Ya know how I know that? Because that stuff is Mine!!!!"

One of them started to stand up. They understood now. They were facing a filthy near-feral and furious biker, who had been on the road for days, wearing bug grimed jeans and the thousand mile slouch of someone who's bike, and the gear on it, are their road survival possessions. And they had taken what was mine.

Things spilled out of my mouth that I had no idea I would ever say. Threats and promises to hurt them came pouring out in a deluge of rage. Stunned, they sat down mutely, knowing that we were way beyond excuses.

The security team came tearing in, announced by the roar of their motorcycles and four wheelers. And I think some among them were as stunned as the thieves. I'm usually a happy hippie biker, there for the music and motorcycles. I don't get into fights. I don't threaten people.

And here I was doing the exact opposite.

I don't remember who got between me and the thieves, walking me away from my targets while listening to me spew

my anger.

Eventually, after the bag burglars had gone with the security team, and my belongings were back in my possession, I went back to my campsite, where I heated up some water for coffee using my returned stove fuel, and then went toward the stages. There were motorcycles, music, and friends to meet.

The next morning, I returned to my job site. And along they came: Hippies and bikers bringing me breakfasts, having heard that my food was stolen, and offers of hot dogs, sandwiches and drinks for later.

I got more than my stuff back. With anger replaced by grateful astonishment at the generosity of fellow festival goers, and their commiseration turned to celebration at the return of my possessions, the rest of the weekend passed in a happy haze of shifts at the shitters, music, motorcycles, occasional episodes with a toilet bowl plunger that I will not detail here, and a constant sense of relief and appreciation.

Late Sunday morning, I slowly began packing my bike while surveying the growing emptiness of the campgrounds. A trash crew had begun the first round of clean-up, broken tents and grills and camp chairs were strewn throughout the fields, stragglers still filling their vehicles with coolers and other detritus. I was heading home after a ride from New York to Sturgis, by way of a huge music festival on the way back. The worst that had happened was temporarily losing my stuff. The best was finding out I was surrounded by generosity.

I bagged up dirty laundry, a sleeping bag, tent and a tarp, and put my campstove, along with its small amount of fuel left, in a saddlebag. The last thing stowed was, as usual, my one person cook-pot, secured on top of duffel bags with a bicycle bungee through its handle.

The tiny bungee had been given to me buy a festival attendee, who had come up to my worksite Friday morning, his hope dwarfing the pencil sized bungee cord as he held it out toward me and said, "I don't know if you can use this or not."

He'd told me to keep it anyway, after I'd protested that I had my stuff back, and the cord was way too small, saying that he wanted me to have it. Laughing, I'd taken the useless bungee and thanked him.

I finished packing up and put the festival and Mariaville in my rear view mirror as I headed to Route 88, thinking about how sometimes when things seem to go completely wrong, there are reminders of just how right things can be, too.

And then I saw a flick in my rearview mirror, followed by a flap-flap-flap of something, and pulled over to the shoulder of the interstate.

The tiny gift OK I'm sure bungee cord had busted. Looking back down the road, I saw my cookpot bounce to a rest in the middle of the interstate, and then get flattened by an eighteen wheeler.



THE RULES HARLEY RENDEZVOUS CLASSIC

AMERICAN MOTORCYCLE RODEO & TRIKE SLED PULL RULES:

The object of the trike sled pull is to pull a weight-transfer sled as far as possible with a "trike" that has been properly hitched to the sled by rodeo personnel and both rider and sled are ready.

A "Trike" is a motorized vehicle having one front wheel and a rear drive axel with no more than one tire on each end. It must be equipped with no more than one Harley Davidson V Twin engine, or Harley V-Twin "After Market Type" engine and drive train.

Trike may have the following:

Fuel - Any pump gasoline and commercial racing gasoline, Methanol: Pure methyl alcohol produced by synthesis; Nitromethane: Produced specifically as a fuel for racing; nitrous oxide, and/or any combination will be allowed

Slipper Clutch - A multi-disc clutch designed to slip until a predetermined rpm is reached decreasing shock load to the drive wheels. **Supercharger -** A crank driven air/fuel-mixture compressor, also called a blower, for the purpose of increasing atmospheric pressure in the engine to produce more horsepower.

Turbocharger - An exhaust-driven intake air compressor (see Kill Switch - Trike must be equipped with a working kill switch. Supercharger). Trikes wheelbase and Frame Construction is subject No part of the trike may interfere with the sled or the hitch during to the approval of the Rules Committee.

Tires - Only rubber tires will be permitted; chains, steel studs and the sled is ready to pull, to make an attempt. Each contestant will be paddles will not be permitted.

Rear Tire - Diameter may not exceed 31' as marked on tire by manufacturer.

The "Rules Committee" reserves the right to specify which tire types, manufacturers brands may or may not be used. The rim width and type construction is also at the discretion of the "Rules Committee"

Hooking Point - The maximum distance from Ground to top of ring will measure no more than 15 inches. The ring must be attached so that it is stationary and parallel to ground level. The hitching device will be a ring measuring 2 inches ID. The maximum distance from the center line of the trikes rear axel to the back of the inside diameter of the hooking ring will be a maximum of 15 inches.

the pull. Bumpers and or Nurf Bars are required to keep the sled from

allowed one attempt. All pulls over 35 feet will be measured.

Contestants must stay within course boundaries. In the event that a rider's pull is stopped by a Rodeo Staff Member due to the development of a dangerous situation, the pull will be measured to the point at which that rider was stopped. If the Rodeo staffs' stopping of the pull was not due to fault of the rider, the rider may forfeit the attempt and pull again.

Disgualification will result for any rider who;

- Is not ready when called to compete.
- Looks back at the sled during the pull. Rider must look forward once pull attempt is begun.
- Rider does not pull within two minutes of being hitched or fails to stop immediately at starters red flag.

Front axel - height is a maximum of 13 1/2 inches. Total weight - Includes trike, rider and any and all equipment, may not exceed 1,100 lbs.

catching on the rear wheels and tires when stopping. All riders are required to wear a helmet and goggles during the pull. IN each class the order will be determined by pulling numbers from a hat.

Since the weight transfer mechanism must be calibrated for each weight class the first rider may, if the referee determines that the sled is properly calibrated, take his first attempt results. If he or she wishes, rider may forfeit the first attempt results and pull again in third position in the rotation. Rider must make that decision before Trike leaves the course.

If the first puller within a class succeeds in making a pull of at least 35 feet all riders in that weight class will pull at that calibration. If the first rider fails to pull 35 feet, the sled will be recalibrated and the pulling rotation will adjust to 2-3-1

Before the pull competition begins, Rodeo Staff will determine a distance that will be known as a "Full Pull". The distance will be determined by course conditions, but will usually be about 100 feet. If more than one rider succeeds in exceeding a "Full Pull", those riders will be run off against each other pulling a recalibrated sled.

All pulls must begin with a taught chain, No slack chain jerking will be permitted.

A rider will be allowed **Two Minutes** after the hitch is attached and
